If so, do they all work? 0 Are there enough work surfaces for all of the dishes to be prepared? 0 Is there a fire exit? If so, make sure you know where it is. 0 (Also, it would be helpful to know where the nearest fire extinguisher, fire blanket and first aid box are) Is there hot and cold running water available? Some venues have separate taps for drinking water. 0 Is there a fridge/freezer? If so, does it work? 0 Is there a microwave? (This is helpful for warming up dishes during last session) 0 Is public transport access convenient to venue? 0 Are parking facilities available for the Club Tutor? 0 Are parking facilities available for the the participants? 0 If the kitchen is higher than ground level, is there a lift available? 0 Is there access for wheelchair users? 0 Is there a kettle for making tea/coffee especially during winter 0 Is there workable heating facilities available? (This would be essential during winter) 0 Is there a seating area? (This is required for filling in forms, discussion and sampling dishes prepared) 0 Does the venue have sufficient toilet/hand washing facilities? 0 Is there a bin with cover, mop/bucket & dustpan/brush? 0 FURTHER INFORMATION -When is the venue available? 0 What are the costs per session? 0 0 Any additional comments? 0 Overall opinion Print Name: Signature: Date:
